Gateway's groundbreaking work has helped hundreds of individuals and their families cope with this often disruptive disability. The ultimate goal is, whenever possible, to help clients stay in and / or return to their communities. To this end, staff travel hundreds of miles to visit families in their home settings. Over the course of a year, they work with them to develop individual treatment strategies and intervention plans that are best suited to the client and the family's needs. The results have been remarkable, enabling many clients to lead fuller, active lives.
